Tips for finding Scholarships, Grants and Bursaries

Scholarships tend to be merit or career based. This means that they awarded to students with certain qualities, such as proven academic, leadership or athletic ability or awarded to students entering a specific career.

Grants focus on a purpose, such as financial need or research.

Bursaries focus on need over merit and are often associated with community involvement or awarded through a specific post-secondary program.

You never have to worry about paying these back! It is free money towards improving your future! However, searching for scholarships is a dedicated process. You need to spend hours researching all the stand-alone scholarships and connecting them to you and your values, skills, attitudes, achievements, passions and goals.

When you apply to post-secondary you will either automatically be put in their awards system or you will be given access to the awards offered by the institution so you may apply.

Most grants and bursaries are provided when you apply for student loans.

Answer the following questions to help you start your search:

- What extracurricular activities do you do inside and outside of school?
- Do you have a part-time job?
- Where do your parents or grandparents work? They might offer family scholarships.
- Are your parents or grandparents involved in community organizations?
- Do you volunteer or participate in a leadership role?
- How are your academics?
- Have you applied to post-secondary?
- Have you researched scholarships offered at your school and in your community?

Tips on Filling Out a Successful Application

1. Once you have completed your research and have a list of potential scholarships, organize it by the date you need to apply by.
2. Collect your applications and note the criteria and required documents. Samples of required documents may include: essays, references, proof of acceptance to post-secondary and transcripts.
3. Complete and send the application by the due date! Early is always better.
4. Talk with your references. Good references include teachers, coaches, employers, volunteer coordinator, career counsellor.
5. Read the instructions SUPER CAREFULLY, make notes of the details and be clear about the requirements
6. Make sure you know who is offering the award and why.
7. After you apply, you need to know when the selection is expected, how and when the funds are distributed.
8. When you win, let us know. We want to celebrate with you!
9. Keep track of the awards you win, the criteria and the amount. You should maintain a record in your portfolio for your future career.
